It is a great pleasure for ENAS that Dr. h.c. Ogi, as a world-wide well-known personality and ambassador for sport, will be the keynote-speaker of the ENAS Conference 2008, followed by a panel discussion.

Peace One Day is a not for profit organisation and aims to raise global awareness of Peace Day (21 September), and to inspire the global community to act on the Day. On 21 September 2007, approximately 100 million people were active on Peace Day in 192 countries. There were life-saving initiatives in 14 countries, and over 80 activities in Afghanistan alone where 1.4 million children were vaccinated against polio.

Their 'One Day One Goal' campaign encourages football matches to be played in every member state of the United Nations on Peace Day, Sunday 21 September 2008. Each match will celebrate cooperation, unity and the power of football to bring people together.

Peace Day is not just about war between nations, it is also about the violence in our homes, communities, schools, and towards our environment. As such it relates to every human being on the planet. Peace One Day aims to inspire young people to become the driving force behind the vision of a united and sustainable world.
